Hiking and Camping

Stay on paths—don't create new paths or widen existing paths. Walk in line rather than side-by-side. If in a high-use area, concentrate into one area for hiking and camping. If in a remote area, spread out. Camp on a durable surface whenever possible. Existing sites are preferred.

Food Prep: *Pack it in, pack it out.*

Stoves are preferred over campfires. If using a campfire, use an existing site or create a mound campfire. One-pot meals are preferred for ease and less trash. Pick up snack wrappers and any processed food from ground.

Latrine

Catholes and urine locations should be at least 200 feet from water, trails, and camp. Catholes should be 6-8 inches deep and 4-6 inches wide; cover when finished. Urinating on rocks, gravel, or pine needles is desirable going on plants.

Toilet paper should be biodegradable, plain white (not patterned), unscented.
